The Infectious Disease Epidemiology Section will hold three one-day trainings for non-Infectious Disease Rapid Response Team members. This training is targeted towards sanitarians, public health nurses, infection control professionals, disease surveillance specialists, epidemiologists, health care providers and other public health care professionals interested in epidemiological principles and outbreak investigations.
