Life Expectancy- Men






Determinants of Health and Their Contribution to Premature Death











Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) Map











The number of adults with Diabetes Mellitus in Region 3 is 29,749. This number could fill the Nicholls State University football stadium almost 3 times.



Estimated Diabetes Cost, 2012











Serious Mental Health Illness and Substance Use Treatment Prevalence Among Adults in Region 3






High School Dropout %, 2013-2014
