




Region 9 Meeting 1 Attendance, by Parish




## Health Outcomes – 2010-2015 (Quality and Length of Life)

# SWOT Emerging Themes

## Priority 1: Behavioral Health, Mental Health, Addictive Disorders

**S:** Awareness of BH/SA issues in Region 9 and services are available

**W:** Lack of transportation & coordination of services (providers, advocacy groups)

**O:** Collaboration/coordination of services & increased education among youth/adults

**T:** Lack of access to care (ins. coverage, transportation, psychiatrists) & state laws/budget

# SWOT Emerging Themes

## Priority 2: Chronic Disease Management

**S:** Numerous and diverse resources exist (community, employer, school, home-based)

**W:** Lack of coordinated education/prevention/care services & structural barriers

**O:** Coordinate efforts & expand built environments to promote healthy living

**T:** Louisiana culture, lack of education, and the health care system's structure

# SWOT Emerging Themes

## Priority 3: Healthcare and Insurance

**S:** St. Tammany Parish's good access to care/ins & growth of new/existing providers

**W:** Lack of wellness programs & collab./coord. of services, limited access to care

**O:** Expand health education, incentives (providers/patients), & telemedicine/social media

**T:** Provider shortage, limited insurance coverage, & budget cuts (state/local levels)

# Health Systems


A health system consists of all organizations, people, and actions whose primary intent is to (promote, restore or maintain health) improve health. This includes efforts to influence determinants of health as well as more direct health-improving activities (WHO).

- Health systems that can deliver **services equitably and efficiently** are critical for achieving improved health status.
- WHO monitoring framework recognized that “**sound and reliable information** is the foundation of decision-making across all health system building blocks.”
- People who are **actively involved** in their own health care tend to have demonstrably better outcomes.

# WHO Health Systems Framework

- **Overall Health System outcomes or goals:**  
Improve *health and health equity* in ways that are responsive to legitimate expectations, financially fair, and make the best, or most efficient, use of available resource.
- **Intermediate Health System goals:**  
The route from inputs to health outcomes is through achieving greater access to and coverage for effective health interventions, without compromising efforts to ensure provider quality and safety.


Figure 1. The WHO Health Systems Framework
